This Eighth Supplemental Administrative Order is issued to modify the restriction or access to the Court's Detention Center.

No COVID quarantine at intake is required for each youth, unless an indicator of sickness is present. No youth needs to be quarantined after being in court or meeting with counsel or anyone else, provided that proper health protocols are followed. Detention intake may continue to segregate youth for up to 48 hours to permit assessment of youth.

Attorneys seeking to consult with their detained clients shall be afforded the opportunity to schedule an in-person meeting with the client in one of the following rooms, if available: hearing room, courtroom, holding cell A or B, or community room. Consultation shall be in private, without any recording device in operation, or with any such device rendered incapable of recording. In the event family is present with the youth and attorney, the meeting shall be in the community room where the visit is supervised by video only.

All counselors, speakers, and any group leaders will be permitted into detention, provided that such persons social distance and wear masks during such times, and all health tests and questions are addressed appropriately. Such individuals may enter at scheduled times only. Probation officers shall also have full access to any detained probationer, provided that advance notice is given and meeting with a youth does not substantially interfere with education of the youth.

To the extent this new order conflicts with the prior order, the new order applies. All prior orders not inconsistent with this order shall remain in effect.
